The **Canadian Lawyers Association for International Human Rights** (CLAIHR) and the **International Law Students Association** (ILSA) University of Ottawa Chapters are joining together to host the 8<sup>th</sup> annual **Global Generations Conference**. The conference will be held on February 24, 2012 at the University of Ottawa, Faculty of Law.

2011 marks the 10th anniversary of the International Commission on Intervention and State Sovereignty's (ICISS) Report on the Responsibility to Protect (R2P). In recognition of this important date and Canada's important role in the creation of this doctrine, this year's Global Generations Conference theme is "The Way Forward - The Promise of R2P".

The conference is extending a call for papers that address the diverse issues raised by the responsibility to protect. Potential topics may include corporate social responsibility, sovereignty, women's rights, children's rights, minority issues, the United Nations and R2P, early warning systems and rebuilding strategies.

This conference is a significant opportunity to share original scholarly work with experts in the field, legal professionals, and students. **Travel support may be available for students based outside of Ottawa.** Eight papers will be selected for presentation at the conference. The expert panel will determine and award a Best Paper Prize. The papers presented at the Conference will also be submitted for publication in the Ottawa Law Review (OLR). Pending approval, the OLR will be creating a special section for the papers selected from the conference.

All submissions require a 200 word abstract. Submission regulations and instructions for authors are available on the OLR website:
